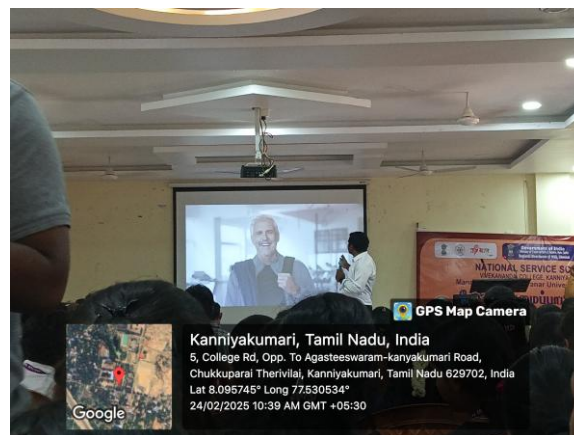


THE ROLE OF ETHICS AND PHILOSOPHY IN YOUNG MINDS AND FEAR:

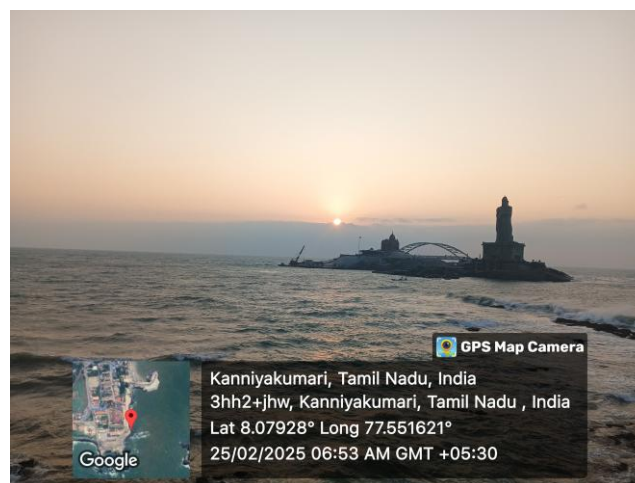
Cultural:

Place: Serugudi Government school playground.

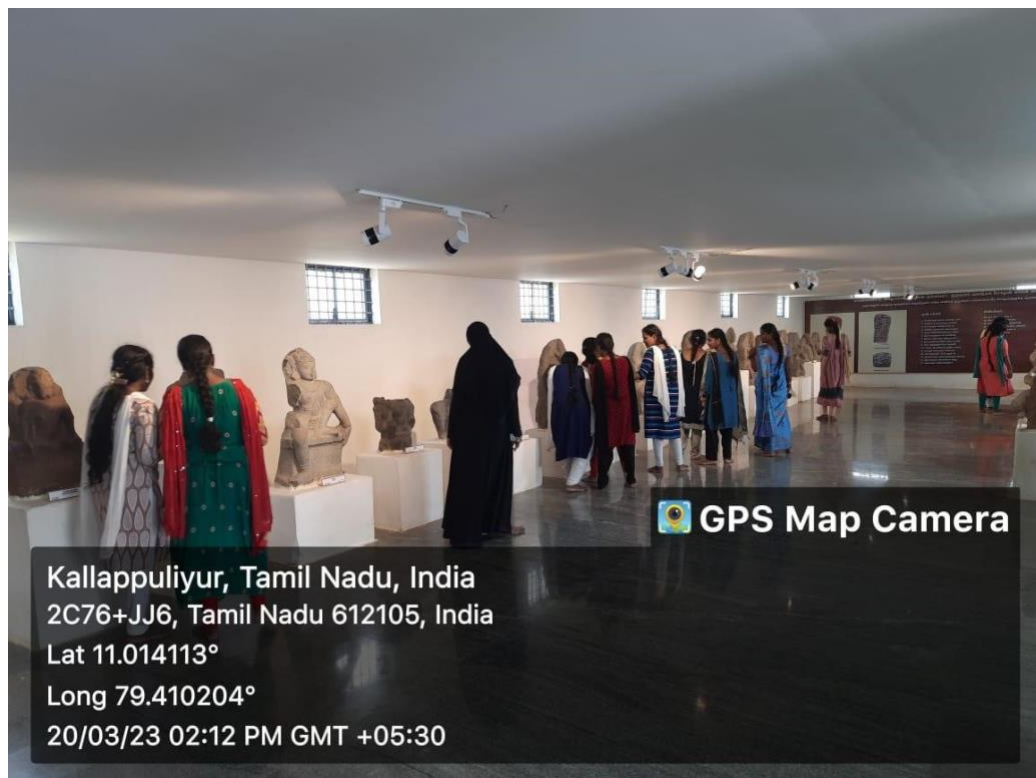
On day 5, We reached the village around 9.30am. NSS Programme officers assigned as the work and we started working.

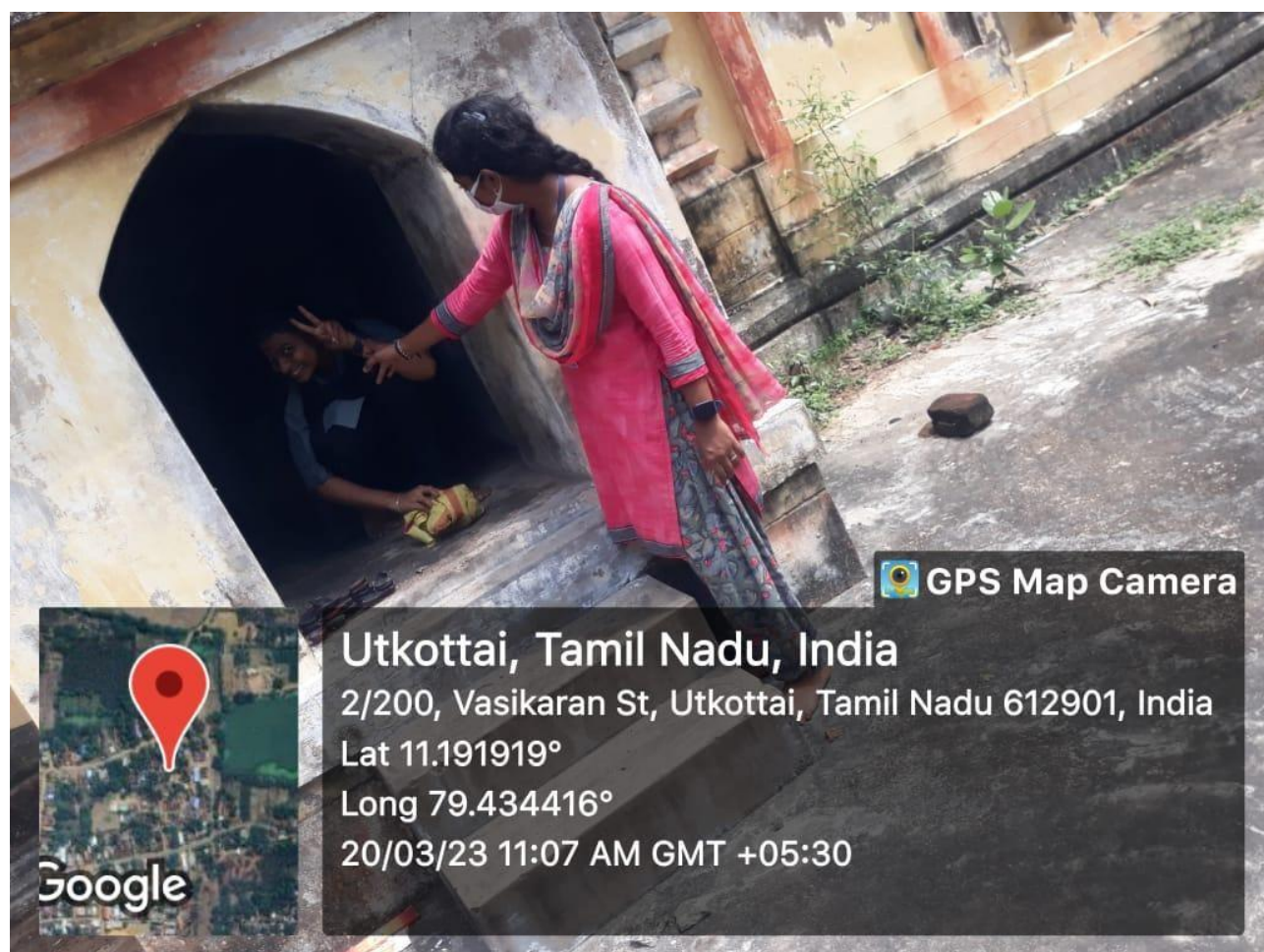

Over the past ten days, we have been through a transformative journey, one that has not only enhanced our physical endurance but has also taught us important values such as discipline, teamwork, and respect for nature.

Day 1: Orientation and Introduction

Our course began with a thorough registration process, where we familiarized ourselves with the institute's facilities. Following that, we visited the institute's museum, which gave us a deeper understanding of the history and significance of mountaineering. In the evening, the contingent was organized, and we selected our rope leaders, equipment in-charges, quartermasters, and senior course members.

Afterward, we gathered in the auditorium for an introductory lecture, followed by a documentary about the institute and its founder, the late Atal Bihari Vajpayee. The briefing provided insight into the importance of mountaineering and allied sports in building both physical and mental strength.



Day 2: Rock Climbing and Basic Skills

On day two, we began our day with early morning exercises to prepare our bodies for the challenges ahead. After collecting our equipment, we headed to the rock field for our first hands-on training in rock climbing. It was an exciting yet challenging experience as we learned the basics of rock climbing and tested our skills by climbing some rocks. This day laid the foundation for our mountaineering journey.



Day 3: Advanced Rock Climbing and Cultural Visit

The third day brought more rock climbing challenges, as we ventured to different areas to practice climbing different types of rocks, each with unique pockets and formations. Later, we visited the local Harimba Temple, which allowed us to experience the rich culture of the region.



Day 4: Rappelling and Knot Techniques

On day four, some of our group members took part in a rappelling session, learning how to safely descend steep rocks. The rest of us stayed back for a session on artificial wall rock climbing. In the evening, we had an instructional session on different types of knots used in mountaineering. These knots are essential for safety, whether we're securing equipment or assisting in rescue operations.

We also learned important "Mountain Manners" during a briefing by our instructor, covering essential do's and don'ts when in the mountains.

Later, we returned to the institute, where we were taught how to make stretchers and how to transport casualties during an emergency. These practical skills are fundamental in ensuring safety in the mountains.



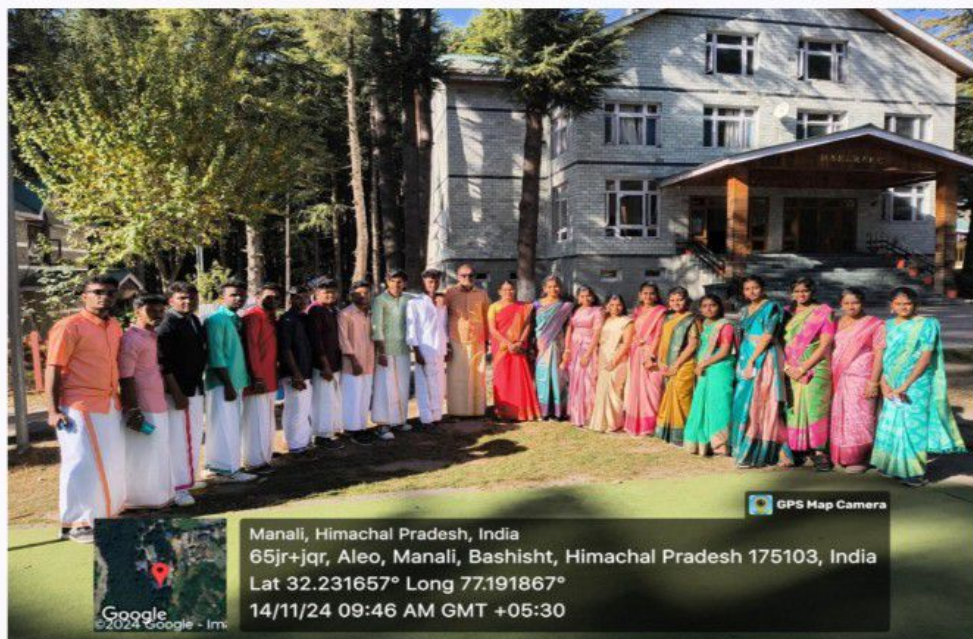
